Bratton Scholarship 2019-2020 - The James and Martha Bratton Scholarship will be awarded annually to a student attending or planning to attend a college or technical school. The amount of the scholarship will not exceed two thousand dollars (\$2,000). The applicant must be a member of a Christian church of Athens County and must have a grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale. Application Deadline is 5:00 p.m., Monday, April 08, 2019. Application packet MUST include: the completed and signed application, two recommendation letters, official transcript from the school most recently attended and a one page essay sharing how your church and activities has influenced your career and college choices.
