FOR WORSHIP

In Mark's Gospel, John the Baptist proclaims a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins and declares the coming of Jesus, who will baptize with the Holy Spirit. In an act of humble obedience, Jesus, the sinless One, is baptized by John. As Jesus rises up from the water, the heavens are opened, and the Spirit descends on Jesus, with his Father declaring "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased." This public declaration of his belovedness and identity as the Son of God confirms the glory and worship given years earlier to the baby Jesus by the Magi, an event the church celebrates as the Epiphany.


