FOR WORSHIP

When Jesus decides to accelerate the spread of the good news into the towns of Galilee, he doesn't send stuff. He sends staff. Not paid staff, of course, but Jesus does send people to do his work. In Luke 10:1-11, 16-20, he commissions 70 (or 72, depending on your preferred manuscript tradition) of his followers to go out and find people receptive to his mission and message. And as he sends these people out, he explicitly forbids them from carrying any stuff with them. By stripping stuff away from the disciples, Jesus forces them to rely entirely on the people they will encounter. It is a risky move. Jesus sends them out "like lambs among wolves," at the mercy of others' mercy.


