MISSION TRIP 2025 June 20-26 Point Pleasant, West Virginia

Come join your fellow members this summer as we volunteer our time and talents once again to the West Virginia Ministry of Advocacy and workcamps. Since October 2001, WVMAW has brought 40-75 volunteer groups per year to work in West Virginia. Their work has consisted of home repair and reconstruction, deconstruction, playground restoration, parks cleanup, streambank stabilization, and vacation Bible schools, among other things. But more than just working with hammers and nails, the groups have built relationships with people in West Virginia, changing lives in the name of Jesus Christ. WVMAW is supported in part by The Presbytery of West Virginia, The Synod of the Trinity, and gifts from churches and individuals. It has a close relationship with Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, particularly in times of disaster recovery.

Groups stay in the Presbyterian Church in Point Pleasant. Two Sunday school rooms are converted into dormitories with bunk beds to accommodate approximately 18 people each. There are four showers. There is a fully equipped kitchen with two stoves, a commercial refrigerator, upright freezer, and microwave, silverware, plates, cups, pots, pans, and cooking utensils. The cost for week-long mission experiences is \$300/person. Scholarships are available. Let the office know if you are interested in joining us on this Mission Trip/Workcamp.
